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Introduction

The Janusz Korczak Association of Canada is happy to present the *Janusz Korczak Bibliography: English Sources 2012 – 2020*.

The bibliography includes all works related to Dr. Janusz Korczak that appeared in English (or were translated into English) between 2012 and the present. It is a continuation of the excellent work by Olga Medvedeva-Nathoo and Galina Sanayeva (Editors) *Janusz Korczak. A Bibliography: English Sources 1939 – 2012*.

We have tried to adhere to the format of the original Bibliography and make it consistent with its structure.

The 2012 - 2020 Bibliography was compiled by Weronika Szulik, a doctoral candidate at the University of Warsaw, Poland. It will be updated every six months.

Weronika Szulik (born in 1991 in Mielec, Poland) graduated with a degree in Polish literature and cultural studies from the University of Warsaw, where she is currently completing her doctoral thesis in the literature under the supervision of Professor Lena Magnone. She is also working on the digital edition of the dictionary “Contemporary Polish Writers and Literature Researchers” at the Institute of Literary Research of the Polish Academy of Sciences (2019–2022). In 2019, she received a scholarship from the August Cieszkowski Foundation to collect materials for a critical edition of Roman Jaworski’s scattered writings (book in preparation). She has published articles on Polish Modernism in various Polish magazines, including “Przegląd Humanistyczny”, “Teksty Drugie”, “Pamiętnik Literacki”, and “Pleograf”, as well as in “Volupté” an English journal devoted to the subject of decadence. She is interested in Polish literature from the late 19th and early 20th century, as well as Polish popular culture, especially silent cinema, of that era.
